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Contract for Business Refusal of Service

<p>Dispute Resolution .4</p>
<p>In the event of a dispute arising from the refusal of service, both parties agree to engage in good faith negotiations and, if necessary, seek resolution through legal means in accordance with the laws of the jurisdiction governing this contract.</p>

Governing Law .5

This contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the jurisdiction in which the Business is located, without regard to conflicts of .law principles

Entire Agreement .6

This contract contains the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous .agreements and understandings, whether written or oral
