Introduction .1
The Parties acknowledge that the legality of divorce in the Philippines is 1.1 .governed by the Family Code of the Philippines

Any attempt to procure a divorce in contravention of the Family Code and 3.2 .other relevant laws shall be deemed illegal and null and void
Governing Law .4
This contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the 4.1 .laws of the Philippines
Any disputes arising out of or in connection with this contract shall be 4.2 .subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of the Philippines
